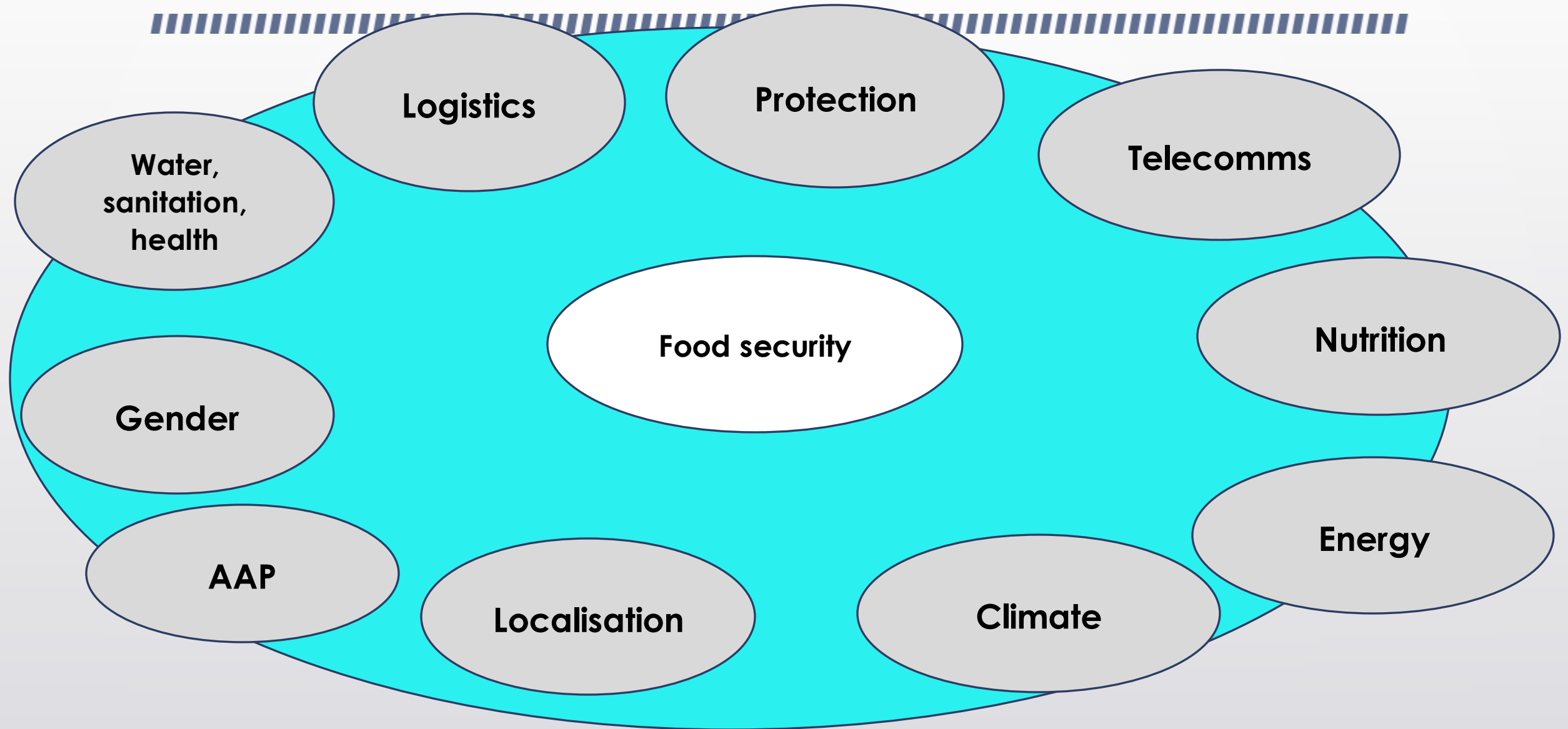

The value of the collective vs. the individual



Global Cluster Coordination Group: IASC-associated entity since January 2019; 11 Global Clusters, 4 AoRs, IMWG

Focus:

- **Operational level:** More support to the field. Enhanced functioning and contextualization of country level inter-cluster/sector coordination
- **Global level:** supporting IASC structures with the revision and development of appropriate tools and guidance for inter-cluster/sector coordination.

Value of collective

- The broad partnership of the clusters, value of the collective.
- Accountability to global CLAs and larger cluster partnership.
- 'Translates' and promotes mainstreaming of normative policy into operational practice

Needs assessments

- *Collective improvement needed on joint analysis, which requires....*
- *Harmonising analysis at the inter-cluster level, but also...*
- *Actively liaising with other clusters*
- *JIAF – collective engagement should continue, sharing of data and joint needs analysis*

The nuts and bolts of coordination

- **Dedicated capacity – across the system**
- **Dedicated cluster coordinators**
- **Performance monitoring – CCPM, ICCG PM**

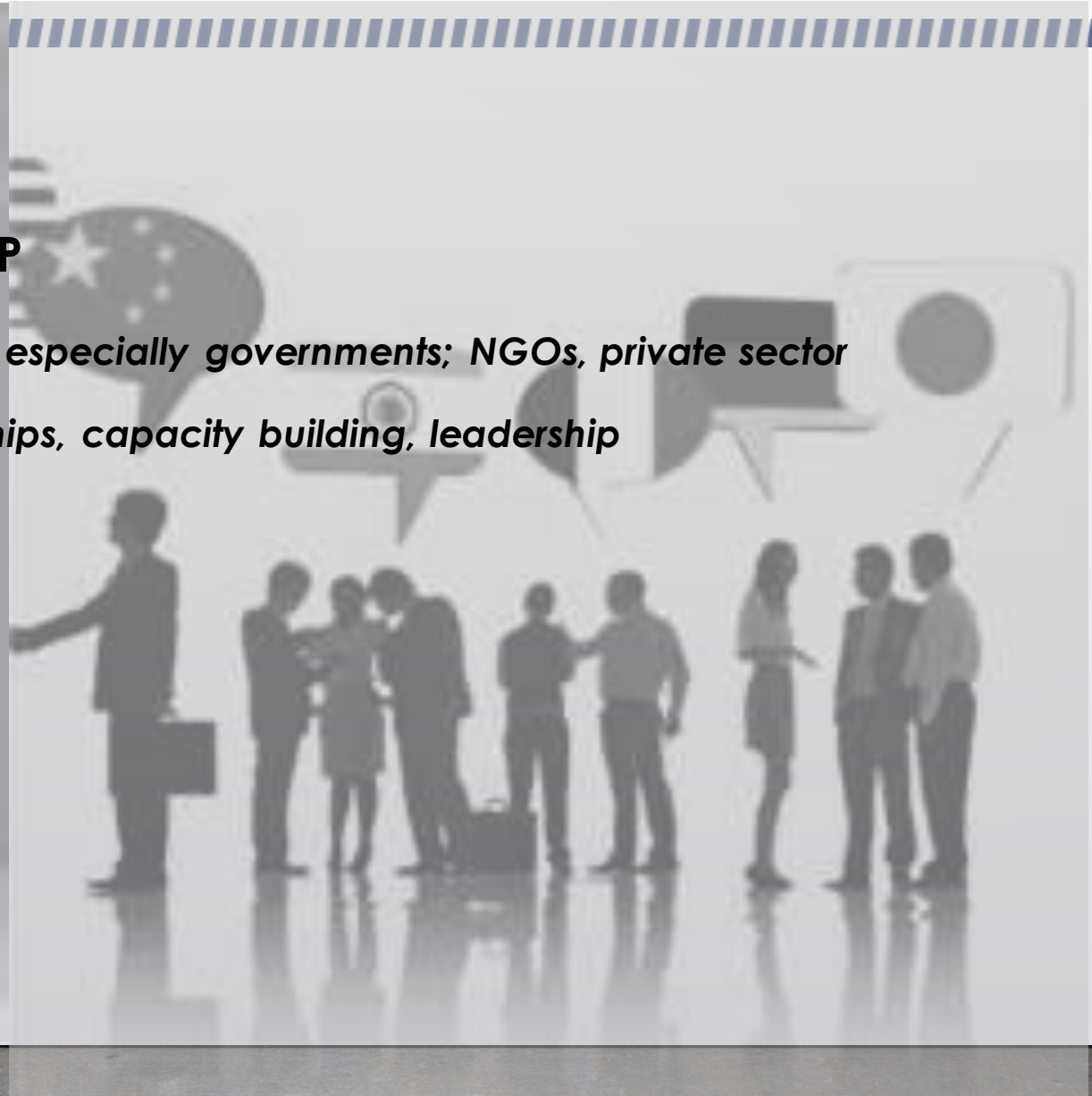
The good news for food security – in 2019 - highest rate of cluster coordinators = 83%

But we need to do better across clusters overall = 59%

The same goes for IMO's (34% global average).

Cross-cutting

- **Localisation, inclusivity, AAP**
 - *Natural alliance with local actors, especially governments; NGOs, private sector*
 - *In coordination, funding, partnerships, capacity building, leadership*
 - *Coordinating feedback loops*
- **Gender**

- **PSEA**
